#### **VT WCC TEAMS AND GOALS**

**Greater Barre:** Lower the rate of single female head of households in poverty by 15% in 10 years. [Backbone: <u>Green Mtn United Way</u>]

**Lamoille**: Build sustainable systems of collaboration to reduce systemic barriers to employment. [Backbone: <u>United Way of Lamoille County</u>]

**Northwest VT**: Attract and retain talent by addressing regional housing challenges. [Backbone: Northwest RPC]


**Northeast Kingdom**: Reduce intergenerational poverty through hubs of financial stability. [Backbone: <u>NEK Collaborative</u>]

**Southern Vermont**: Attract and retain a new workforce through building a diverse, welcoming community. [Backbone: <u>Brattleboro Development Credit Corp</u>]

**Springfield Area**: Increase workforce participation in the Springfield region by creating a sustainable, collaborative workforce development pipeline to focus on recruitment and retention. [Backbone: <u>Springfield RDC</u>]

White River Valley: Attract and retain entrepreneurs and young workers through housing. [Backbone: <u>Vital Communities</u>]

**Winooski**: Ensure that the people making community decisions accurately reflect the demographics of our community by bringing new voices to the table throughout decision-making. [Backbone: <u>City of Winooski</u>]



## KEYS TO SUCCESS: WHAT MAKES WCC DIFFERENT Civic Leadership and Sustained Focus on Economic Development Goals

- Long-term systems change solutions are developed in partnership with people with lived experience (experts by experience)
- Solutions to problems are created with a learning agenda by providing patient and flexible capital for experimentation
- Collaborative teams are provided with the necessary resources (staff, time, expertise and focus) to work across sectors (public, private, and nonprofit) and across boundaries (towns, regions) to support community-driven economic development.
