


Who are we and what do we do?




What are we hearing from small businesses?

Trends from the CNPP small business survey regarding legal services:

- I don't know what I don't know
- The law is confusing and scary
- I don't know whether, when, and how to work with an attorney
- Lawyers are inaccessible and costly
- The bar is not representative of me or my background

Business legal needs are wide-ranging:

- Business entity and governance
- Intellectual property protection
- Drafting contracts
- Protecting against risks
- Funding and investment



Future projects

State Small Business Credit Initiative (SSBCI) Technical Assistance

Grant Program

- Five-year program, funded through Treasury
- Access to capital for very small businesses and minority-owned businesses
- Legal services to support businesses seeking funding

Center for Small Business and Community Legal Education

- Congressional Directed Spending, procured with help from Senator Sanders' office
- Small Business Administration will administer
- Extension of CNPP model, but broader offerings, including services for non-profits
