1	TO THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
2	The Committee on Corrections and Institutions to which was referred
3	House Bill No. 493 entitled "An act relating to capital construction and State
4	bonding" respectfully reports that it has considered the same and recommends
5	that the bill be amended by striking out Secs. 17 and 18 and inserting a new
6	Sec. 17 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 17. FY 2024 AND 2025; CAPITAL PROJECTS; FY 2024
8	APPROPRIATIONS ACT; INTENT; AUTHORIZATIONS
9	(a) Findings. The General Assembly finds that in addition to the issuance
10	of general obligation bonds, eligible capital projects may be funded from the
11	Fund established in 32 V.S.A. § 1001b.
12	(b) Intent. It is the intent of the General Assembly to authorize certain
13	capital projects eligible for funding by 32 V.S.A. § 1001b in this act but
14	appropriate the funds for these projects in the FY 2024 Appropriations Act. It
15	is also the intent of the General Assembly that the FY 2024 Appropriations Act
16	appropriate funds to the Fund established in 32 V.S.A. § 1001b for projects in
17	FY 2025, which shall be allocated pursuant to the process set forth in
18	subsection (e) of this section.
19	(c) Authorizations. In FY 2024, spending authority for the following
20	capital projects are authorized as follows:

1	(1) the Department of Buildings and General Services is authorized to
2	spend \$250,000.00 for planning, reuse, and contingency;
3	(2) the Department of Buildings and General Services is authorized to
4	spend \$135,000.00 for 32 Cherry Street, parking garage repairs;
5	(3) the Department of Buildings and General Services is authorized to
6	spend \$1,000,000.00 for the renovation of the interior HVAC steam lines at
7	120 State Street;
8	(4) the Department of Buildings and General Services is authorized to
9	spend \$600,000.00 for planning for the boiler replacement at the Northern
10	State Correctional Facility in Newport;
11	(5) the Department of Buildings and General Services is authorized to
12	spend \$750,000.00 for planning for renovations to the administration building
13	West Cottage, at the Criminal Justice Training Council in Pittsford;
14	(6) the Department of Buildings and General Services is authorized to
15	spend \$600,000.00 for the Agency of Human Services for the planning and
16	design of the booking expansion at the Northwest State Correctional Facility;
17	(7) the Department of Buildings and General Services is authorized to
18	spend \$1,500,000.00 for the Agency of Human Services for the planning and
19	design for the replacement of the women's correctional facility and reentry
20	facility;

1	(8) the Department of Buildings and General Services is authorized to
2	spend \$1,000,000.00 for the Agency of Human Services for the planning and
3	design of the Department for Children and Families' short-term stabilization
4	facility;
5	(9) the Department of Buildings and General Services is authorized to
6	spend \$750,000.00 for the Judiciary for renovations at the Washington County
7	Superior Courthouse in Barre;
8	(10) the Department of Buildings and General Services is authorized to
9	spend \$250,000.00 for the Department of Public Safety for the planning and
10	design of the Special Teams Facility and Storage;
11	(11) the Department of Buildings and General Services is authorized to
12	spend \$250,000.00 for the Department of Public Safety for the planning and
13	design of the Rutland Field Station;
14	(12) the Department of Buildings and General Services is authorized to
15	spend \$300,000.00 for the Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets for the
16	planning and design of the Vermont Agriculture and Environmental
17	<u>Laboratory Heat Plant.</u>
18	(13) the Department of Buildings and General Services is authorized to
19	spend \$1,000,000.00 for electric vehicle charging stations at State buildings;
20	(14) the Vermont State Colleges is authorized to spend \$9,000,000.00
21	for construction, renovation, and major maintenance at any facility owned or

1	operated in the State by the Vermont State Colleges; infrastructure	
2	transformation planning; and the planning, design, and construction of Green	
3	Hall and Vail Hall;	
4	(15) the Agency of Natural Resources is authorized to spend	
5	\$9,700,000.00 for the Department of Environmental Conservation for the State	
6	match to the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act for the Drinking Water	
7	State Revolving Fund and the Clean Water State Revolving Fund;	
8	(16) the Agency of Natural Resources is authorized to spend	
9	\$4,500,000.00 for the Department of Environmental Conservation for the	
10	Waterbury Dam rehabilitation;	
11	(17) the Agency of Natural Resources is authorized to spend	
12	\$4,000,000.00 for the Department of Environmental Conservation for the	
13	Municipal Pollution Control Grants for pollution control projects and planning	
14	advances for feasibility studies;	
15	(18) the Agency of Natural Resources is authorized to spend	
16	\$3,000,000.00 for the Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation for the	
17	maintenance facilities at the Gifford Woods State Park and Groton Forest	
18	State Park; and	
19	(19) the Agency of Natural Resources is authorized to spend	
20	\$800,000.00 for the Department of Fish and Wildlife for infrastructure	

1	maintenance and improvements of the Department's buildings, including
2	conservation camps.
3	(d) FY 2025 Capital Projects. To the extent general funds are available to
4	appropriate to the Fund established in 32 V.S.A. § 1001b in FY 2025, it is the
5	intent of the General Assembly that the following capital projects receive
6	funding from the Fund:
7	(1) the sum of \$250,000.00 to the Department of Buildings and General
8	Services for planning, reuse, and contingency;
9	(2) the sum of \$2,300,000.00 to the Department of Buildings and
10	General Services for parking garage repairs at 32 Cherry Street in Burlington;
11	(3) the sum of \$2,000,000.00 to the Department of Buildings and
12	General Services for the renovation of the interior HVAC steam lines at 120
13	State Street in Montpelier;
14	(4) the sum of \$1,000,000.00 to the Department of Buildings and
15	General Services for the Judiciary for renovations at the Washington County
16	Superior Courthouse in Barre;
17	(5) the sum of \$1,000,000.00 to the Department of Buildings and
18	General Services for the Department of Public Safety for the planning and
19	design of the Special Teams Facility and Storage;

1	(6) the sum of \$1,000,000.00 to the Department of Buildings and	
2	General Services for the Department of Public Safety for the planning and	
3	design of the Rutland Field Station;	
4	(7) the sum of \$1,500,000.00 to the Vermont Veterans' Home for design	
5	for the renovation of the Brandon and Cardinal units;	
6	(8) the sum of \$500,000.00 to the Department of Buildings and General	
7	Services for the Newport courthouse replacement, planning, and design.	
8	(9) the sum of \$250,000.00 to the Department of Buildings and General	
9	Services for planning for the 133-109 State Street tunnel waterproofing and	
10	Aiken Avenue reconstruction; and	
11	(10) the sum of \$200,000.00 to the Department of Buildings and	
12	General Services for the renovation of the stack area, HVAC upgrades, and the	
13	elevator replacement at 111 State Street.	
14	(e) Recommendation. On or before December 15, 2023:	
15	(1) the Secretary of Administration shall review and recommend capital	
16	projects to be funded from the Fund established in 32 V.S.A. § 1001b; and	
17	(2) the Secretary of Administration shall submit the list of capital	
18	projects recommended for FY 2025 to the Chairs of the House Committee on	
19	Corrections and Institutions and the Senate Committee on Institutions and to	
20	the Governor for the FY 2025 capital budget adjustment report.	
21	and by renumbering the remaining sections to be numerically correct.
