



The VTARNG infrastructure strategy is focused on a regional readiness center concept. The regional concept establishes or repurposes existing readiness centers into "Multi-Unit Readiness Centers". These facilities will support 2 or more units.

The CFMO seeks to capitalize on NGB/HQDA methodology of fix/replace worst first.

Goal #1: Systematically replace Vermont's 19 aged Readiness Centers:

- 1. 68.42% of VTARNG Readiness Centers are 55+ years old
- 2. 26.31% of VTARNG existing Readiness Centers are 30+ years old
- 3. VTARNG is short of 54.14% of authorized Readiness Center square footage.

<u>Goal #2</u>: Utilize NGB Tier 1 priorities to expand opportunities to improve facilities for VT Soldiers. Tier 1 facilities include: Readiness Centers, Vehicle Maintenance Facilities (FMS/CSMS), Army Aviation Facilities, CST Facilities, Barracks, Ranges that support IWQ/CSWQ/Gunnery tables.


Goal #3: Generate as much capital as possible from facility sales to offset state funding match requirements for new properties and infrastructure.






CURRENT INFRASTRUCTURE SUMMARY:

- 20 Sites across VT
- 19 Guard Readiness Centers
- 5 Maintenance Facilities
- 4 Training Facilities (Over 12,000 acres of land)
- 3 School Houses
- 2 Co-Use Army Guard/Army Reserve
- 1 Army Aviation Support Facility









Readiness Center Consolidation Concept 25 Year Master Plan

Consolidate Readiness Centers in Bennington, Berlin, Lyndonville, Northfield, Newport, Swanton, Saint Albans, Winooski, Waterbury, Westminster.

Endstate: Add 4 new Regional Readiness Centers in Northeast, Northwest, Central, and Southern, Vermont, while upgrading readiness centers that are staying in inventory to make them compatible with current mission.

Timeline:

(2020 - 2028):

Close Waterbury, Winooski, Lyndonville, and Newport, Open Green Mountain Armory Addition, Northeast Regional Readiness Center - Lyndon, Smith Goldberg Readiness Center (2029 - 2037):

Close St Albans, Swanton, Open Northwest Regional Readiness Center

(2038 - 2045):

Options to Close Berlin and Northfield, Open Central Vermont Readiness Center.

Or Close Bennington and Westminster and Open Southern Vermont.

Look for opportunities to consolidate FMS 2, Morrisville, Stone/Wing, and Williston pending expansion capabilities of other facilities.

Timelines are estimated on current projections for Military Construction schedules. Each State should get one project every 7-10 years. The CFMO is working to accelerate projects as much as possible.
