### Vermont Fish and Wildlife Department Summary of Unspent Capital Funds February 2024

#### Appropriation 6120991902 (SFY20 funds) – Fish Culture Stations; \$59K balance

The funds remaining in this appropriation are obligated via a contract to Vanasse Hangen Brustlin to pay for sampling and testing related to the NPDES discharge permit at Salisbury Fish Culture Station.

#### Appropriation 6120992001 (SFY21 funds) – Infrastructure; \$0 balance

There is currently a zero balance in the appropriation.

## Appropriation 6120992101 (SFY22 funds) – FW-Infrastructure Proj; \$375,638 balance

\$279K of the remaining balance is earmarked for infrastructure improvements at the Department's five Fish Culture Stations to include:

- \$36K of projects completed and waiting for final invoices
- \$243K of projects in process or out to bid and will be completed by Summer of 2025. This includes two major projects at Ed Weed Fish Culture Station; pumphouse electrical work (\$90K) and wastewater treatment plant repairs (\$122K). Repairs on the wastewater treatment plant are being done inhouse by fish culture staff so there is not a formal VISION

encumbrance. Additional project details:

\$95K of the remaining balance is earmarked for replacement of the workshop at Dead Creek WMA. This project has been subject to numerous setbacks including problems with the original design for building replacement, unanticipated problems with asbestos and the integrity of the original foundation and cost of materials and labor beyond the amount of money originally budgeted for the project. In SFY24 the department was appropriated additional capital funds to cover the increased cost and work is now continuing. Architect and engineering services are under contract, a clerk of the works

contract is in process and a construction contract is expected to be executed, and fund obligated, prior to June 30, 2024.

### Appropriation 6120992201 (SFY23 funds) – FW-Infrastructure Proj; \$857,151 balance

\$25,621 earmarked for residence repairs and maintenance and GMCC road repairs.

\$452,803 earmarked for infrastructure improvements at the Department's five Fish Culture Stations to include:

- \$105K contracted and encumbered for roof replacement at Ed Weed
- \$118K in projects that have been completed and waiting for final invoices
- \$42K contract in place to pay for sampling and testing requirements at Salisbury Fish Culture Station as described in detail above.
- \$150K set aside for shingle replacement on all roofs at the Salisbury Fish Culture Station. Some of the roofs are close to leaking and most of them are approaching the end of their service life. These funds were appropriated in SFY23 but upon RFP submissions from contractors, it was clear that the cost would be substantially higher than anticipated. Additional capital funds were requested and appropriated in SFY24 for this project and now the work may continue. Despite conversations about closure of the facility in SFY25, the Department is obligated to maintain the buildings.

\$37,600 earmarked for dock maintenance at access areas and will be spent by the end of FY24.

\$336,540 of the remaining balance is for public access improvements on Wildlife Management Areas. Specifically:

- \$50K dedicated to infrastructure improvement and maintenance projects on WMAs in all 5 districts. Due to staff capacity limitations, we are behind in completing these projects. Nevertheless, the projects remain priorities and we will spend these funds by the end of FY25.
- \$196K for the Dead Creek workshop as explain in detail for appropriation 6120992101 above.
- \$90K dedicated to several projects in the Springfield, Essex, Barre and St. Johnsbury districts. These projects include expanded and improved parking areas and information kiosks at several WMAs in those districts, in addition to road

improvements to enable better public access. These funds will be spent before the end of FY25.

• \$4,500 will be used to match federal funds on state owned ranges and will be spent by the end of FY25.
