6	Subject: Education; school safety; violent intruder model policy
7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require the
8	Agency of Education, in consultation with stakeholder groups, including
9	mental health professionals, the Vermont School Boards Association, the
10	Vermont Principals' Association, Vermont-NEA, law enforcement officials,
11	and representatives of families and caregivers, to establish a model policy
12	regarding school safety for violent intruders for all Vermont school districts.
13	The model policy shall require:
14	(A) that school safety drills for violent intruders:
15	(i) be trauma-informed and age appropriate;
16	(ii) involve school-based mental health professionals;
17	(iii) be prohibited for students in grades below 9th grade; and
18	(iv) do not mimic an actual incident or require students in 9th grade or
19	above, including college and university students, to physically practice being
20	in a lockdown; and

1	(B) that school districts provide advance notice of any drills to parents and
2	caregivers and track the efficacy of drills and their effects on students and
3	staff.
4	Each school board shall develop, adopt, and ensure implementation of, and
5	make available in the manner described in 16 V.S.A. § 563(1), a school safety
6	policy for violent intruders that shall be at least as comprehensive as the model
7	policy established by the Agency of Education. Any school board that fails to
8	adopt such a policy shall be presumed to have adopted the most current model
9	policy published by the Agency of Education.
