8	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require public
9	high school students to pass a civics test as a condition of graduation.
10 11	An act relating to the requirement to pass a civics test for high school graduation
12	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
13	Sec. 1. GOALS
14	In order to ensure that Vermont public school students who are awarded a
15	high school diploma have a basic understanding of U.S. civics and history and
16	to promote and encourage active and engaged citizenship, Vermont students
17	shall pass, as a condition of being awarded a high school diploma, the basic
18	civics test produced by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services and
19	administered to all applicants for U.S. citizenship.

2	§ 914. HIGH SCHOOL CIVICS EDUCATION REQUIREMENT
3	(a) Vermont students shall, as a condition of being awarded a high school
4	diploma, successfully complete one of the following options related to civics
5	education:
6	(1) Take and receive a passing grade on the U.S. citizenship civics test,
7	produced by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services and administered
8	to all applicants for U.S. citizenship, subject to the following terms and
9	conditions:
10	(A) students shall be tested on all questions on the civics test, with a
11	minimum score of 60 percent required for passage; and
12	(B) students may take the civics test as many times as may be
13	necessary for passage.
14	(2) Complete one semester of community service by volunteering with a
15	local government office, subject to the following terms and conditions:
16	(A) Students shall work with a local government mentor, who shall
17	be an official or employee of the student's chosen local government
18	organization.
19	(B) Students shall submit proof of completion on a form developed
20	by the school district and signed by the student's local government mentor.

- 9 This act shall take effect on July 1, 2023 and shall apply to high school
