### **Academic Resources on Campus**

Specific programs for all eligible students offered at admission

Combination of or at least one of the following:

- First generation
- Income eligible
- Students with a disability
- Underserved population

### Summer Bridge- summer before first year of college for a week

• Provides overview of college experience

- Workshops, projects, experiential activities for a range of topics including study strategies, time management, and writing academic papers
- Prepares incoming students academically, socially, and financially

## **Academic Resources on Campus**

### **Student Support Services**

- McNair Scholars- federal program to promote doctoral study
  - Provides academic preparation for graduate level work
  - Graduate school application advisement
  - Provides graduate level mentors who prepare students to engage in graduate level presentations and research

### TRIO- federal program to help students persist and succeed

- Upward Bound
  - Tutoring assistance
  - Career counseling
  - Peer mentoring

### **Academic Resources on Campus**

- Advising Model- 1<sup>st</sup> year students receive a dedicated professional advisor to work with them for duration of program
  - Connects students with academic, financial, and social resources
  - Student issues/concerns can be triaged and solved more easily
  - Student connection to staff person makes success more likely

#### Academic Support Immediately

Career, internship support and placement from the first year

### Since summer 2023, housing options are available year round

# **Out of Classroom Resources**

Housing options vary based on campus; include traditional style, apartment, suite style

### Housing is available year round for students

- Meal plan while classes are in session
- Each campus has kitchen facilities for students' use
- Federal work study jobs available on each campus

#### Summer/Class Not in Session

- Meals are not provided
- Discounted housing rates for students

# **Financial Resources**

- Vermont State Grant Application
  - Tuition free for state residents beginning fall 2024
  - Student/family contribution must be \$50K or less
  - For students seeking initial undergrad degree
  - State, federal, institutional aid applied first
