





United States National Forest Inventory




- ~140K forested plots across all states and territories
- FIA has multiple components including:
 - Rural and Urban forest inventory
 - National Woodland Owner Survey
 - Timber Products Output surveys

Vermont Forest Inventory



- Over 900 "forested" plots in Vermont
- 7-year inventory cycle
- 3x intensification on National Forest lands


Vermont Forest Land Trends




- Forest land base increased substantially between 1948 and 1973, peaked at 4.63 million acres in 1997, and has since decreased slightly to a **current** estimate of 4.53 million acres.
- According to FIA change statistics (2021), VT is losing approximately 13K acres of forest land annually (~10K net loss).
- 4th most forested state, with 76 percent of land in forest.

Forest Land Owner Demographics








TOP 5 CONCERNS
