2 Representative Beck of St. Johnsbury moves that the House propose to the
3 Senate that the bill be amended as follows:

4 First: In Sec. 6, Public Utility Commission implementation, in subsection
5 (f), in subdivision (1), by striking out “January 15, 2025” and inserting in lieu
6 thereof “September 15, 2024”

7 Second: In Sec. 6, Public Utility Commission implementation, by striking
8 out subsection (i) in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof a new subsection
9 (i) to read as follows:

10 (i) Check-back report. On or before February 15, 2024, the Commission
11 shall submit a written report to and be available to provide oral testimony to
12 the House Committee on Environment and Energy and the Senate Committees
13 on Finance and on Natural Resources and Energy detailing the efforts
14 undertaken to establish the Clean Heat Standard. The report shall include, to
15 the extent available, estimates of the impact of the Clean Heat Standard on
16 customers, including impacts to customer rates and fuel bills for participating
17 and nonparticipating customers, net impacts on total spending on energy for
18 thermal sector end uses, fossil fuel reductions, greenhouse gas emission
19 reductions, and, if possible, impacts on economic activity and employment.
20 The modeled impacts shall estimate high-, medium-, and low-price impacts.
21 The report shall recommend any legislative action needed to address

1 enforcement or other aspects of the Clean Heat Standard, including how to
2 ensure fuel use that occurs outside the thermal sector is not impacted under the
3 program.

4 Third: In Sec. 3, 30 V.S.A. chapter 94, in section 8127, by striking
5 subsection (e) in its entirety and relettering the remaining subsections to be
6 alphabetically correct.
