Vermont Has Some Pretty Spectacular Waterbodies


















Human Activity Can Harm Our Waters



Clean Water Initiative

- Water quality concerns are not unique to Vermont
- Nutrient problems exist in many freshwater lakes
 - EPA's 2017 National Lakes Assessment found that 20% of the nation's lakes had high levels of phosphorus or nitrogen.
 - Notable examples include:
 - Lake Pepin, MN
 - Lake Erie
- How does Vermont's response to compare to others?
 - We are taking good, important, meaningful steps
 - Regulatory programs that exceed federal minimums for stormwater and agriculture
 - Committed resources (i.e., Clean Water Fund)





Clean Water Initiative

- Vermont has a long-held commitment to clean water and water quality
 - ANR has worked with EPA to develop "pollution budgets" or total maximum daily loads (TMDLs) for waterbodies like:
 - Lake Champlain
 - Lake Memphremagog
 - Lake Carmi
 - Connecticut River/Long Island Sound
 - Many of the commitments made in these TMDLs were codified in statute in Act 64 (2015) and Act 76 (2019)
- Broadly, clean water funding is used to:
 - Restore water quality in lakes and rivers that do not meet standards
 - Protect high quality waterbodies



How is Clean Water Work Funded



Avg Annual State Funding = \$50-60 M/yr

FY24/25 Capital Bill – Section 10

AAFM:

• Water Quality Grants:

\$2,202,019

• Practices include: manure and agricultural waste storage facilities, composting stack pads, silage leachate collection, laneway development & stream crossings, and clean water diversions

ANR

Forestry Access Road Water Quality Improvements:

\$550,000

• Practices to reduce erosion and nutrient and sediment pollution from ANR's road and trail network and recreational access points

VHCB

\$2,800,000

- Agricultural Water Quality Projects
 - Water-quality related investments in-fee lands and conservation easements
 - Land Conservation and Water Quality Projects
 - Grants to farmers for water quality-related capital practices and purchase of marginal farmland; grants typically help pay for project components that are not covered by other state/federal programs
