Asset Building

- **612** Vermonters received coaching to build assets and increase financial skills
- **817** enrolled in financial capability classes
- **197** New Americans participated in financial coaching, house parties and classes
- **4,696** Vermonters received tax assistance
- \$5,194,997 in tax refunds were returned to the Vermont economy through the VITA Program with an additional \$1,222,054 in tax credits
- **368** Vermonters Increased their savings

Children and Families

- 4 1.007 Vermont children were served through Head Start and Early Head Start
- **1,297** home visits were made
- **504** Vermont children received dental assessments and **588** children received physicals
- **873** Vermont parents improved family functioning skills
- 495 Vermont families attended parenting classes addressing barriers to stability
- **697** Vermont children became ready for kindergarten

Community Building

- 4 684 Vermonters attended Fair Housing workshops to learn about housing discrimination
- **406** Vermonters found low/no cost clothing, furniture and household items with NEKCA, SEVCA and BROC
- Vermonters received training in the NEKCA and BROC Community Justice Program
- 4 1,331 Vermonters avoided evictions
- **485** Vermonters improved their leadership skills through engagement in Community Action Programs
- **315** Vermonters improved self-employment skills to provide for themselves and their families
- **448** Vermonters found safety in domestic and sexual assault intervention programs at CVOEO
- **1,832** hotline calls, web-chats and email assistance were provided support to those experiencing domestic and sexual assault

Health and Well Being

- 🖊 Community Kitchen Academy employed past graduates to feed the hungry
- **15,971** Vermonters were assisted in applying for SNAP benefits
- 4 14,008 hot meals were made and distributed to those who are food insecure
- **11,541** boxes/bags of groceries were distributed

Housing Assistance, Homeless Housing

- 4 VCAP Agencies provided services to the homeless in hotel settings. CVOEO has a Street Outreach Team, operating 2 homeless shelters and offers a Community Resource Center
- 4 337 Vermonters experiencing homelessness were provided emergency housing
- 4 943 individuals experiencing homelessness were helped to find permanent housing
- **482** Vermonters received security deposits
- **4 1,143** Vermonters received rental assistance

Weatherization, Climate Action, Emergency Home Heating, Crisis Fuel, Warmth

- 4 1,039 units/homes were weatherized by Community Action Agencies
- 4 \$1,688,842 was spent on labor, materials and replacement systems through the Emergency Heating Repair and Replacement program
- 4 There is a zero deferral policy in Weatherization because of funding to include heat pumps, wood and pellet stoves with an overview to energy savings
- 4 VCAP Agencies engaged in the effort to make our world safer and more sustainable through participation in the work of the VT Climate Council
- 4 7,651 Vermonters were served through the Crisis fuel Program for short term emergency assistance
- 4 \$805,258 was raised in the heating season for the Warmth Program which is a sustained entirely by donations
