History and Background

SEMP is responsible for all energy management measures in state buildings and facilities

2014: ACT 178 Capital Bill established the SEMP

- State Energy Revolving Fund.
- State Resource Management Revolving Fund.

2016: ACT 58 Big Bill augmented the SEMP for four years.

- Efficiency Vermont Reimburses the State of Vermont for three full time employees.
- BGS and Efficiency VT are required to save \$150,000 in energy savings annually.

2022: ACT 172 Municipal Energy Resilience Program augmented the SEMP for four years.

• Within the expansion of services to municipalities, the existing SEMP is extended through 2027.


- Investment Grade Energy Audit
 - BGS Maintains 3 Million Square Feet of owned facility space
- Project Scope Development and Funding
 - SEMP contains 2 Revolving Loan Funds
 - Project Managers develop SOW and oversee construction







Results





Integrating a Culture of Energy Efficiency

- To embed a culture of energy efficiency and improve communication and collaboration, staff was co-located in:
 - The Planning and Property Management Division
 - The Design and Construction Division
- This will allow a pipeline of energy efficiency projects to be incorporated into Capital Bill line item and Major Maintenance projects and provide technical assistance to both divisions.



Expansion of Services: Municipal Energy Resilience Program

- Act 172 Signed June 2 2022, "An act relating to municipal energy resilience initiatives"
- \$45M ARPA Funding for the program to:
 - Conduct building assessments
 - Education and outreach
 - Energy resilience improvement projects





- BGS granting \$2.4M to Regional Planning Commissions to build capacity.

Funding for Communities




- 1. Municipal Resilience Educational Grants

 - Fully funded until \$5M in funds are exhausted



- 3. Energy Resilience Projects
- Up to \$500,000 per covered municipality

Planning & Property Management Aiming to make municipal buildings more energy efficient, resilient, and reliable, \$45M has been appropriated to the Vermont Department of Buildings and Government Business Services General Services to expand the State's energy management program to municipal buildings to promote increased resilience and sustained connection to critical Vermont Information Centers Division services for all Vermonters. Covered municipal buildings include cities, towns, fire districts or incorporated villages, and all other governmental incorporated units except for school districts. Energy Office Applications will be available for free energy resiliency assessments. Grants of up to \$4,000 will be available to facilitate commun Vermont State Curator's Office communication about municipal energy resilience. Grants of up to \$500,000 will be available for approved projects for weat supplement or replace fossil fuel heating systems with more efficient renewable or electric heating systems.
