


1. Provide a funding breakdown for the mobile crisis funding request, including descriptions of each line item outlining the role/purpose within the implementation plan and timeline


- a. Is the requested funding anticipated to fund the whole program between now and 2027?
 - i. The funding for Mobile Crisis Response anticipates a delayed start for all regions, anticipating services will begin in September of 2023.
 - ii. The current budget is a valuation for the program, while data is collected in the first years to inform a final rate for the service. The final rate will be informed by many factors, including the payer mix, time and location of services, and the composition of the multi-disciplinary team that will include peers.
