



• 2023 PN: 100%


• 2023 ADN: 94.8%

Nursing Expansion

Made possible by \$800,000 in Legislative funding and \$6.3 million in Congressionally Directed Spending secured by Senator Leahy.

Funding supports:

Capital Investments:

- Johnson Nursing Education Center
- Williston Nursing Education Spaces
- Castleton Telepresence Classroom

Equipment:

- Simulator Purchases
- AV Installations Simulation Labs
- Bed Replacement
- Telepresence Classrooms

When complete, VTSU will be able to increase nursing student enrollment in Vermont – up from 676 last year to nearly 1,000 students.



Challenges & Opportunities

Opportunities:

- Partnerships with clinical agencies and networks to grow student numbers and partner for providing clinical instructors.
