7	(a) In fiscal year 2024, \$20,000,000.00 is appropriated from the General
8	Fund to the Vermont Housing and Conservation Board to support any
9	transition services necessary to terminate the hotel and motel housing program
10	established in response to the COVID-19 public health emergency. Using the
11	appropriated funds, the Vermont Housing and Conservation Board shall
12	implement supports, in consultation with the Department for Children and
13	Families and other stakeholders, to locate alternative housing for the following
14	households participating in the hotel and motel program on June 1, 2023:
15	(1) a household that lost its housing due to a natural disaster, such as a
16	flood, fire, or hurricane;
17	(2) a household that has a member who has experienced domestic
18	violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking;
19	(3) a household that has a member who has experienced a dangerous or
20	life-threatening incident related to violence against the member that either
21	occurred within the member's home or caused the member to reasonably
22	believe that the member was at risk of further harm if the member remained in
23	the home;

1	(4) a household with a child or children who are either under 18 years of
2	age or who are 18 or 19 years of age and attending secondary school on full-
3	time basis or an equivalent level of vocational or technical training;
4	(5) a household that has a member who is 60 years of age or older;
5	(6) a household that has a member who receives SSI or SSDI;
6	(7) a household that has a member who is pregnant;
7	(8) a household that is pursuing legal resolution of violations of the
8	Rental Housing Health Code through the Department of Health or appropriate
9	local officials; and
10	(9) a household that has been physically barred from entering their
11	residence through an intentional act of the landlord.
12	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly that the appropriation in
13	subsection (a) of this section shall reduce the General Fund fiscal year 2024
14	funds available for child care and early education policy adjustments from
15	\$91,679,795.00 to \$71,679,795.00.
