1	TO THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
2	The Committee on Human Services to which was referred Senate Bill No.
3	183 entitled "An act relating to reenvisioning the Agency of Human Services"
4	respectfully reports that it has considered the same and recommends that the
5	House propose to the Senate that the bill be amended by striking out all after
6	the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
7	Sec. 1. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE
8	(a) Since its establishment in 1970, Vermont's Agency of Human
9	Services has grown significantly in both size and scope. In its current
10	form, the Agency is composed of six departments: the Department for
11	Children and Families; the Department of Corrections; the Department of
12	Disabilities, Aging, and Independent Living; the Department of Health;
13	the Department of Mental Health; and the Department of Vermont Health
14	Access, along with several divisions, and many offices, boards, and
15	councils. The Agency's budget comprises more than half of the overall
16	State budget and the programs and benefits administered by the Agency
17	and its departments have an impact on the lives of all Vermonters.
18	(b) The purpose of this act is to create a meaningful process through
19	which the Agency, its departments, and the individuals and organizations
20	with whom they engage most can collaborate to identify opportunities to
21	build on past successes and to make improvements for the future.

1	Sec. 2. REENVISIONING THE AGENCY OF HUMAN SERVICES;
2	REPORT
3	(a) The Secretary of Human Services, in collaboration with the Deputy
4	Secretary of Human Services and the commissioner of each department within
5	the Agency of Human Services and in consultation with the Office of the
6	Health Care Advocate; the Office of the Child, Youth, and Family Advocate;
7	Disability Rights Vermont; the Office of the Long-Term Care Ombudsman;
8	relevant commissions, councils, and advocacy organizations; community
9	partners; individuals and families impacted by the Agency and its
10	departments; and other relevant interested stakeholders, shall consider
11	options for reenvisioning the Agency of Human Services, such as restructuring
12	the existing Agency of Human Services or dividing the existing Agency of
13	Human Services into two or more separate agencies.
14	(b) The Secretary of Human Services and the other stakeholders identified
15	in subsection (a) of this section shall evaluate the current structure of the
16	Agency of Human Services, identify potential options for reenvisioning the
17	Agency and engage in a cost-benefit analysis of each option, and develop one
18	or more recommendations for implementation. The Agency shall solicit
19	open, honest feedback from the stakeholders to inform the evaluation,
20	identification of options, and development of recommendations.

1	(c) On or before February 1, 2025 2026, the Secretary shall provide the
2	recommendations developed by the Secretary and stakeholders to the House
3	Committees on Government Operations and Military Affairs, on Health Care,
4	and on Human Services and the Senate Committees on Government
5	Operations and on Health and Welfare, including the following:
6	(1) the rationale for selecting the recommended option or options;
7	(2) the likely impact of the recommendations on the departments within
8	the Agency and on the Vermonters served by those departments, including
9	Vermonters who are members of historically marginalized communities;
10	(3) how the recommendations would center the needs of and lead to
11	better outcomes for the individuals and families served by the Agency and its
12	departments and make the Agency more accountable to the Vermonters whom
13	it serves;
14	(4) how the recommendations could improve collaboration, integration,
15	and alignment of the services currently provided by the Agency and its
16	departments and how they could enhance coordination and communication
17	among the departments and with community partners;
18	(5) how the recommendations could address the workforce and
19	personnel capacity challenges that the Agency and its departments encounter;
20	(6) how the recommendations could address the technology and facility
21	challenges that the Agency and its departments encounter;

1	(7) how the recommendations could strengthen the use of
2	technology to improve access to programs and services, increase
3	accountability, enhance coordination, and expand data collection and
4	analysis;
5	(8) a transition and implementation plan for the recommendations that is
6	designed to minimize confusion and disruption for individuals and families
7	served by the Agency and its departments, as well as for Agency and
8	departmental staff;
9	(9) a proposed organizational chart for any recommended
10	reconfigurations; and
11	(10) the estimated costs or savings associated with the
12	recommendations.
13	Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE
14	This act shall take effect on passage.
