6	existing records related to the death and on interviews of any persons identified
7	in existing records as potentially having information about the source of the
8	firearm used in the death if the source is not stated in any existing records.
9	(2) A person providing information in an interview pursuant to this
10	section shall be immune from criminal prosecution for any disclosure of
11	responsive information that indicates criminal activity may have occurred if
12	there is no existing criminal investigation underway at the time of the
