**Subject:** Proposed language for H655

(1) For petitions filed pursuant to subdivision (a)(1)(A) of this section, the court shall grant the petition and order that the criminal history record be sealed if the following conditions are met:

(A) The petitioner has completed any sentence or supervision for the offense, and in the case of violations of Fish and Wildlife laws under title 10 part 4, the petitioner's license to hunt, fish or trap is no longer under revocation.

## Page 17, lines 3-4

(1) At least three years have elapsed since the date on which the person 3 satisfied the judgement, or in the case of violations of Fish and Wildlife laws under title 10 part 4, at least five years have elapsed since the date on which the person satisfied the judgement.
