20	Agency shall include the annualized amount necessary to support this

1	(h) One-time funding.
2	(1) The sum of \$150,000.00 is appropriated from the General Fund to
3	the Office of the Defender General in fiscal year 2025 to restore funding for
4	the Public Defense Special Fund.
5	(2) The sum of \$300,000.00 is appropriate from the General Fund to the
6	Center for Crime Victim Services in fiscal year 2025 to cover the deficit in the
7	Domestic and Sexual Violence Special Fund.
8	(i) Annually, as part of their budget presentations, the agencies that
9	received new positions pursuant to this section shall report on the status of
10	their case backlogs and caseload pressures, as applicable, and on any need to

14	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2024, except that Secs. 3 (add-back of

17	after January 1, 2025.
