1	Second: In Sec. 8, Joint Legislative Justice Oversight Committee review;
2	competency examinations, by striking out subsection (c) in its entirety and
3	inserting in lieu thereof a new subsection (c) to read as follows:
4	(c) On or before November 15, 2023, the Committee shall recommend any
5	changes it deems advisable to 13 V.S.A. § 4814(d) (permitting competency
6	examinations by doctoral-level psychologists trained in forensic psychology)
7	to the Senate and House Committees on Judiciary, the Senate Committee on
8	Health and Welfare, the House Committee on Health Care, and the House
9	Committee on Human Services
