



Population of the United States





THE PROBLEM: Too many streets are designed exclusively or almost exclusively for automobile travel, with little consideration given to the needs of people who walk, roll or ride a bike.



According to the U.S. Census Bureau, 8.3 percent of households do not own or have access to a motor vehicle and must rely on biking, walking and/or public transit to get around.

Actions Needed

Policy:

- Incorporate Complete Streets into VSS
- Vtrans should establish a policy manual that details potential avenues for municipalities to be provided more design flexibility on "main streets" located on state highways.
- H. 685: Prioritizes Vulnerable Users (1) Update the definition of pedestrian; (2) Addresses sidewalk requirement

Funding:

- Increase funding for the Bike and Pedestrian Grant Program, Downtown Transportation Fund, Better Places Program and Better Connections Program.
- Expand municipal planning grant program to support Master Plan Development
- Reduce local grant requirements where possible
- Target funding for Complete Streets within designated centers
- Fund Complete Streets Trainings
