Downtown Designation Program

24 designated downtowns

This community revitalization program is designed to preserve the character and enhance the future of medium to large sized historic centers by incentivizing public and private investments, improving quality of life and encouraging economic development. Municipalities that receive designation collaborate with local non-profit downtown organizations supporting efforts through funding, staff, partnerships and volunteers.



Downtown Designation Program





Burlington

- Streetscape improvements
- Parking facilities

- Maximum annual grant is \$200,000
- 20% match required
- Applications due January 31 awarded in March
- 24 months to start project
- 36 months to complete



- 2021 \$5M one time allocation
- Expanded eligibility to include eligible Designated Village Centers
- 2022 \$2,098,094 awarded to 15 communities
- 2023 \$1,316,184 requested from 8 communities (pending review and award in March)


