6	Subject: Property tax; education spending; exclusion; salary increase
7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to exclude from
8	a school district's education spending 75 percent of qualifying salary increases
9	for licensed teachers and other school employees if the school district qualifies
10	under one or both of the weighting categories of rurality or poverty and if the
11	school district pays licensed teachers and other school employees a minimum
12	salary of \$50,000.00 or a minimum hourly wage of \$20.00 per hour in one or
13	more years during fiscal years 2025–2027.
14 15	An act relating to an education spending exclusion for salary and wage increases
16	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
17	Sec. 1. EDUCATION SPENDING EXCLUSION; TEACHERS AND
18	OTHER SCHOOL EMPLOYEES; SALARY OR WAGE
19	INCREASE; FISCAL YEARS 2025–2027

1	(a) Notwithstanding 16 V.S.A. § 4001(6) or any provision of law to the
2	contrary, in fiscal years 2025-2027, a qualified school district's education
3	spending shall be reduced by 75 percent of the aggregate salary increase of the
4	qualified school district in each fiscal year.
5	(b) As used in this section:
6	(1) "Aggregate salary increase" means the aggregate salary and wage
7	increase actually paid by the school district to licensed teachers and other
8	school employees in the fiscal year, to be calculated as follows:
9	(A) for each salaried licensed teacher and other school employee
10	whose fiscal year 2024 salary was less than \$50,000.00, subtracting the
11	teacher's or employee's fiscal year 2024 salary from \$50,000.00;
12	(B) for each licensed teacher and other school employee who is
13	employed on an hourly basis and whose fiscal year 2024 hourly wage was less
14	than \$20.00, subtracting the teacher's or employee's fiscal year 2024 hourly
15	wage from \$20.00 and multiplying the difference by the number of hours the
16	teacher or employee works or is contracted to work in the fiscal year; and
17	(C) adding together the amounts calculated in subdivisions (A) and
18	(B) of this subdivision 1 for every licensed teacher and other school employee
19	in the district.
20	(2) "Licensed teacher" means a teacher licensed under 16 V.S.A.
21	chapter 51.

1	(3) "Other school employee" means an individual employed by the
2	school district who is not a licensed teacher.
3	(4) "Qualified school district" means a school district as defined under
4	16 V.S.A. § 11(10) that, during one or more fiscal years in fiscal years 2025,
5	2026, and 2027:
6	(A) pays a minimum annual salary of \$50,000.00 to all licensed
7	teachers and other school employees who are employed by the district and
8	salaried;
9	(B) pays an hourly wage of at least \$20.00 per hour to all licensed
10	teachers and other school employees who are employed by the district on an
11	hourly basis; and
12	(C) under one or both of the following weighting categories:
13	(i) qualifies as having low population density as defined under
14	16 V.S.A. § 4010(b)(2); or
15	(ii) has 40 percent of pupils whose families are at or below 185
16	percent of the Federal Poverty Level as determined under 16 V.S.A.
17	§ 4010(b)(1)(E).
18	(c) In the event a school district wishes to become a qualified school
19	district but is subject to a collective bargaining agreement for one or more
20	bargaining units that prevents it from paying all licensed teachers or other
21	school employees, as applicable, the annual salary or hourly wage required

- pursuant to subdivision (b)(4) of this section, the school district shall negotiate

 any necessary amendments to such a collective bargaining agreement with the

 appropriate labor organization pursuant to the requirements of 16 V.S.A.

 chapter 57 and 21 V.S.A. chapter 22, as applicable.
