13	(A) licensed nursing assistants, licensed practical nurses, registered
14	nurses, and advanced practice registered nurses licensed under 26 V.S.A.
15	chapter 28;
16	(B) private investigators, security guards, and other persons licensed
17	under 26 V.S.A. chapter 59;
18	(C) real estate appraisers and other persons or business entities
19	licensed under 26 V.S.A. chapter 69; and
20	(D) osteopathic physicians licensed under 26 V.S.A. chapter 33;
21	(E) audiologists licensed under 26 V.S.A. chapter 67; and

1	(F) speech-language pathologists licensed under 26 V.S.A. chapter
2	<u>87</u> .
3	and by renumbering the remaining section to be numerically correct.
4	Second: After Sec. 4, 3 V.S.A. § 123(j)(1), by adding a new Sec. 5 to read
5	as follows:
6	Sec. 5. 26 V.S.A. § 3290 is amended as follows:
7	§ 3290. ELIGIBILITY FOR AUDIOLOGIST LICENSE
8	To be eligible for licensure as an audiologist, an applicant shall have:
9	(1) Either:
10	(A) A a master's degree or equivalent in audiology or speech-
11	language pathology from an educational institution approved by the Director,
12	with course work completed in areas specified by rule; or
13	(B) a doctoral degree in audiology, or an equivalent doctoral degree
14	regardless of name, from a program that is accredited by an accrediting agency
15	recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation, or its
16	successor, or by the United States Department of Education and operated by a
17	college or university accredited by a regional or national accrediting
18	organization.

20	and by renumbering the remaining section to be numerically correct.

1	Third: By striking out the newly renumbered Sec. 6, effective date, in its
2	entirety and inserting in lieu thereof a new Sec. 6 to read as follows:
3	Sec. 6. EFFECTIVE DATES
4	This section, Sec. 4 (3 V.S.A. § 123(j)(1)), and Sec. 5 (26 V.S.A. § 3290)
5	shall take effect on July 1, 2023. Secs. 1–3 (audiologists and speech-language
6	pathologists compact) shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
