17	All members shall be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent
18	of the Senate. In the appointment of the nonstudent members, priority shall be
19	given to the selection of persons with a demonstrated commitment to ensuring
20	quality education for Vermont students. To the extent possible, the members
21	shall represent the State's geographic, gender, racial, and ethnic diversity. The

1	representation of the Board shall reflect the enrollment of students, such that if
2	94 percent of publicly funded students are enrolled in public schools, not less
3	than 90 percent of members of the Board shall reside in a school district that
4	operates public schools, have worked in public schools, or have sent the
5	member's children to public schools. Not more than one member shall be
6	appointed from the same school district and its member towns. The Secretary
7	Commissioner shall serve on the State Board as a nonvoting member. The

9	(1) Six members shall be appointed by the Governor, including the

21	shall, biennially in the month of February with the advice and consent of the

1	Senate, appoint members for terms of six five years. The terms shall begin
2	March 1 of the year in which the appointments are made. A member serving a
3	term of six five years shall not be eligible for reappointment for successive
4	terms.
5	(2)(5) In the event of any vacancy occurring in the membership of the
6	Board, the Governor appointing authority that made the initial appointment to
7	the vacated term shall fill the vacancy within 60 days with a qualified person
8	whose appointment shall be for the unexpired portion of the term. <u>Vacancies</u>
