Subject: Education Spending

Date: January 30, 2024

One-time warned budget collection:

- Received 106 responses of budgeted expenditures, offsetting revenue, and calculated education spending
- 5 Districts are not far enough along in their process to provide budgets, they provided an expected % increase to FY24 education spending
- 8 Districts and 3 unorganized towns and gores did not provide a response.
- Responses represent 97.23% of FY25 LTWADM
- Year-over-year increase for education spending is up 14.3% statewide.
- Responding district's (n=111) average increase is 14.84% up slightly from the December 1 letter of 12%. 14.84% increase is applied to the 9 that did not respond as a best estimate.

Table 1 is based on n=106 responses to warned budget data (total expenditures and offsetting revenues)

Table 2 is the updated projection for all districts using 106 responses of total expenditures and offsetting revenue, 5 responses of a % increase to FY24 education spending and 11 districts using the weighted average percent increase of 14.84%
