Thank you for the opportunity to provide an update on School Finance Cost Drivers.

Background

The committee asked for an overview of what is driving \$200+ million Education Fund increase for FY 2025 compared to FY 2024. This data is based on self-reported budget data from Vermont School Districts. This excludes unorganized towns and gores.

Disclaimer

The Agency of Education, specifically the School Finance team, is aware that the two items presented today February 27th tell two different stories for similar data points. The data underlying these estimates are different. The intent of both is the quantify some of the primary drivers for a \$200M plus ed spend increase from FY 2024 to FY 2025.

The legislative survey data (provided to House Ways and Means) is a collection of responses from over 80% of supervisory unions.

The FY 2025 preliminary summary (provided to Senate Finance) includes other sources such as the state auditor's office, a February 26, 2024 updated education spending statewide projection, and estimates based on average inflation at a statewide level.

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District Cost Drivers

Based on 27 districts where the weighted increases of other district responses are applied.

Model A: Assuming "normal" spending growth trends

This model assumes spending growth trends similar to what we see in a "normal" year, e.g. 3% increase in salary and benefits.

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Model B: Based on Observed Trends

This model extrapolates observed cost trends (e.g. 6% increase in salary and benefits, increase capital construction costs) to project statewide education spending growth.
