1	TO THE HONORABLE SENATE:
2	The Committee on Agriculture to which was referred House Bill No. 205
3	entitled "An act relating to establishing the Small Farmer Diversification and
4	Transition Program" respectfully reports that it has considered the same and
5	recommends that the Senate propose to the House that the bill be amended by
6	striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the
7	following:
8	Sec. 1. 6 V.S.A. §§ 4608 and 4609 are added to read:
9	§ 4608. SMALL FARMER DIVERSIFICATION AND TRANSITION
10	<u>ASSISTANCE</u>
11	(a) The Working Lands Enterprise Board shall award small farmers in
12	Vermont with grants to diversify production on a farm or to transition from one
13	form of farming to another. Grants to small farmers shall be used for costs of:
14	(1) diversifying the farm products produced by the applicant;
15	(2) transitioning the applicant from one form of farming to another;
16	(3) processing of farm products on the farm owned or controlled by the
17	applicant; and
18	(4) developing an accessory on-farm business by the applicant.
19	(b) The maximum amount of a grant to a small farmer under this section
20	shall be \$15,000.00 per farmer per year, and all projects funded by the grant

1	shall be completed within 12 months after receipt of the grant by the small		
2	farmer.		
3	(c) The Working Lands Enterprise Board shall develop a short, accessible,		
4	and easily completed application form for the purpose of applications under		
5	this section. The Board also shall simplify and streamline its process for		
6	review and approval of applications under this section.		
7	(d) As used in this subchapter:		
8	(1) "Farm products" means products principally produced by a small		
9	farmer from:		
10	(A) crops grown, growing, or to be grown, including:		
11	(i) plants grown for food, feed, or fiber, but excluding trees grown		
12	for timber purposes;		
13	(ii) Christmas trees;		
14	(iii) maple sap;		
15	(iv) horticultural, viticultural, or orchard crops, and		
16	(v) pasture; or		
17	(B) livestock, born or unborn, including goods produced in		
18	aquacultural operations.		
19	(2) "Small farmer" means any person:		
20	(A) who owns or operates a small farm subject to the Required		
21	Agricultural Practices;		

1	(B) houses not more than the number of animals specified under
2	section 4857 of this title; and
3	(C) is not permitted as a medium farm or large farm at the time of
4	application.
5	§ 4609. CONFIDENTIALITY OF FINANCIAL INFORMATION
6	A tax return and related financial documents, correspondence, and
7	substantiating forms that are submitted by an applicant for financial assistance
8	to the Working Lands Enterprise Board under this subchapter shall be exempt
9	from public inspection and copying under the Public Records Act and shall be
10	kept confidential.
11	Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION
12	In addition to any other funds appropriated to the Agency of Agriculture,
13	Food and Markets in fiscal year 2024, \$350,000.00 of one-time funds are
14	appropriated from the General Fund in fiscal year 2024 to the Agency of
15	Agriculture, Food and Markets for purposes of implementing the small farmer
16	diversification and transition grants under the Working Land Enterprise
17	Program.
18	Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE
19	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
