

- Founded in 1977
- Conserved 11% Vermont, over 620,000 acres
- Steward 2,300 easements
- 46 employees statewide
- \$28M in revenue 90% invested back on the land







2022 Results

- 13,500 acres protected
- 2,300 parcels stewarded
- 15 farms protected
- 35 miles of streams and 348 acres of wetlands conserved
- 7,700 lbs. of produce grown for food shelves
- 3,900 trees and shrubs planted
- 26 events with over 2,300 attendees


Harrison Farm, Addison

Over 1,000 farms conserved 158,000 acres protected Over 100 successful transfers




Doyle Family Fletcher, VT
