7	Sec. 1. 33 V.S.A. § 1901m is added to read:
8	§ 1901m. MEDICAID COVERAGE FOR DOULA SERVICES
9	(a) The Department of Vermont Health Access shall provide
10	reimbursement to a qualified doula for providing childbirth education and
11	support services, including physical and emotional support, to an individual
12	covered by Medicaid during pregnancy, labor and delivery, and the postpartum
13	period, regardless of the outcome of the pregnancy.
14	(b) As used in this section, "qualified doula" means a doula who is
15	registered with or certified or licensed by the Office of Professional
16	Regulation.
17	Sec. 2. MEDICAID REIMBURSEMENT FOR DOULA SERVICES;
18	LEGISLATIVE INTENT
19	It is the intent of the General Assembly that the Department of Vermont
20	Health Access reimburse qualified doulas in amounts that are reasonable and

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1	adequate for the services provided and that are consistent with the		
2	reimbursement rates set by other states' Medicaid programs.		
3	Sec. 3. OFFICE OF PROFESSIONAL REGULATION; DOULAS; SUNRISE		
4	REVIEW		
5	(a) The Office of Professional Regulation, in consultation with interested		
6	stakeholders, shall undertake a review of doulas in accordance with 26 V.S.A.		
7	chapter 57 to determine the appropriate form of regulation for the profession.		
8	For purposes of this review, and in accordance with 26 V.S.A. § 3105(b), the		
9	General Assembly finds that it is necessary for the State to regulate doulas.		
10	(b) On or before January 8, 2025, the Office of Professional Regulation		
11	shall report the results of the review required by subsection (a) of this section		
12	to the House Committees on Health Care and on Government Operations and		
13	Military Affairs and the Senate Committees on Health and Welfare and on		
14	Government Operations, including a recommendation regarding whether		
15	doulas in Vermont would be regulated most appropriately through a		
16	registration, certification, or licensure process, along with the Office's		
17	proposals for legislative action to establish that process.		
18	Sec. 4. STATE PLAN AMENDMENT		
19	The Department of Vermont Health Access shall seek a state plan		
20	amendment from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services if needed to		

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1	allow Vermont's Medicaid program to provide coverage for doula services in		
2	accordance with Sec. 1 of this act.		
3	Sec. 5. EFFECTIVE DATES		
4	(a) Sec. 1 shall take effect on July 1, 2025 or, if a state plan amendment is		
5	necessary, upon approval of the state plan amendment, whichever is later.		
6	(b) The remaining sections shall take effect on passage.
