2	The Committee on Economic Development, Housing and General Affairs to			
3	which was referred House Bill No. 127 entitled "An act relating to sports			
4	wagering" respectfully reports that it has considered the same and recommends			
5	that the Senate propose to the House that the bill be amended as follows:			
6	First: In Sec. 1, 31 V.S.A. chapter 25 (sports wagering), in section 1302			
7	(Department of Liquor and Lottery; authority and duties), in subdivision (c)(5),			
8	following the words "The Department shall establish" by striking out "a			
9	process that allows a holder of a joint bank account to exclude the joint			
10	account from all operator platforms in the State" and inserting in lieu thereof			
11	procedures to exclude player accounts based on joint financial responsibility			
12	before the period.			
13	Second: In Sec. 1, 31 V.S.A. chapter 25 (sports wagering), in section 1302			
14	(Department of Liquor and Lottery; authority and duties), in subsection (g), by			
15	striking out subdivisions (1) through (3) in their entireties and inserting in lieu			
16	thereof new subdivisions (1) and (2) to read as follows:			
17	(1) a provision that prohibits the use of sports wagering advertisements.			
18	logos, trademarks, or brands on products that are sold in Vermont and intended			
19	primarily for persons under 21 years of age; and			
20	(2) an advertising plan, which shall include strategies to limit unwanted			
21	advertising and advertising aimed at persons under 21 years of age.			

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1	Third: In Sec. 1, 31 V.S.A. chapter 25 (sports wagering), in section 1320			
2	(sports wagering operators; competitive bidding process), in subsection (c), by			
3	striking out subdivisions (2) through (6) in their entireties and inserting in lieu			
4	thereof new subdivisions (2) through (6) to read as follows:			
5	(2) For two operators, \$412,500.00 per operator.			
6	(3) For three operators, \$366,666.00 per operator.			
7	(4) For four operators, \$343,750.00 per operator.			
8	(5) For five operators, \$330,000.00 per operator.			
9	(6) For six operators, \$320,833.00 per operator.			
10	Fourth: In Sec. 1, 31 V.S.A. chapter 25 (sports wagering), in section 1341a			
11	(Problem Gambling Program), in subsection (a), by striking out subdivisions			
12	(2) through (5) in their entireties and inserting in lieu thereof new subdivisions			
13	(2) and (3) to read as follows:			
14	(2) promote public awareness of and provide education concerning			
15	gambling addiction using online capabilities and other best practices; and			
16	(3) promote public awareness of assistance programs for gambling			
17	addiction using online capabilities and other best practices.			
18	Fifth: In Sec. 2a, appropriations, by adding a subsection (c) to read as			
19	follows:			
20	(c) In each fiscal year after fiscal year 2025, a sum equal to five percent of			
21	the annual sports wagering revenue received by the Department of Liquor and			

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1	Lottery shall be appropriated from the Sports Wagering Fund to the		
2	Department of Mental Health for purposes of the	Problem Gambling Program.
