Southwest Vermont Regional Technical School District

- We serve all schools in Bennington County (Mount Anthony, Arlington, Burr and Burton, Long Trail) as well as Hoosick Falls in NY.
 - Approximately 400 students attend our school.
 - Programs Include:
 - ▶ Building Trades, Cosmetology, Auto Tech, Forestry & Heavy Equip, Manufacturing Tech, Medical Professions, Culinary, Human Services
 - ▶ Pre-Law, Business, Accounting, Graphic Arts, Law Enforcement, Video & TV Production
- Adult Technical Education
 - ► Goal is to serve approximately 100 adult learners per year in programs that provide industry recognized credentials, workforce certifications and employability skills.
 - Partner with Dept of Labor, HireAbility, Local Industry, Adult Basic Ed, Reach Up, and others.


Adult Tech Ed at Southwest Tech

- We have a number of programs in the 2022-23 school year that offer essential workplace certifications and skills in person and online:
 - Licensed Nursing Assisting
 - Commercial Driver's License
 - CNC Machining
 - Dental Assisting
 - Custom Courses for Industry
 - ▶ New this year will be **Welding**, **Computer Basics**, **and Heavy Equipment Operation**
 - ▶ Online offerings include Medical Administrative Asst, IT Support Specialist, & Legal Secretary
 - ▶ All offer options for industry recognized credentials
- Tuition ranges from \$199 for Computers to \$2999 for CDL. VSAC provides considerable tuition support.
- Most programs are 6-12 weeks.
- Many are found on the McClure Foundation's list of Vermont's Most Promising Jobs




Adult Tech Ed in Vermont

- ▶ All 17 tech centers operate adult technical education.
 - ▶ All tech centers employ someone in an adult tech ed role administrative role, all are VACTEA members.
 - ▶ Some adult CTE programs enroll only a handful of students, others enroll hundreds.
 - Significant variation in support and resources for adult tech ed statewide.
- We have a statewide website listing all classes offered in the near future.
 - ▶ We drive traffic to this site so people can see where classes and trainings are offered.

- ► Encourage a focus on Industry Recognized Credentials
- High school students are eligible and encouraged to participate in many of these programs.
- Examples of programs offered statewide: LNA, CDL, & Welding
- Other regional offerings: HVAC, Phlebotomy, Electrical, Dental Asst, EMT, Natural Gas Cert
- Personal Interest Courses: Woodworking, Blacksmithing, Small Engine Repair, Culinary



Adult Technical Education By the Numbers



- Since 2019:
- ▶ We've collectively served 8700 unique students at all our member centers combined.
- ▶ We have an approximately 87% completion rate statewide.
- Almost 3300 IRC earned.
 - ▶ All of these numbers will increase as we finalize our 2022 data.
- More than half of the students served come from centers who employ either a full time adult tech ed coordinator or are in Chittenden Co.
 - ▶ Southwest Tech, Stafford Tech, North Country, Lyndon Institute, Center for Tech Essex

Strengths

- Adult Technical Education is a very effective part of Vermont's CTE education and workforce training system. We are nimble and able to create programs of need quickly.
- ► CTE centers have awesome classrooms and labs that can accommodate many different types of classes and trainings that benefit adult learners.
- Adult CTE provides short term, cost effective, and flexible CTE training and industry recognized credentials meeting the workforce needs of Vermont's citizens and industry.
- Many of the jobs we train for provide livable entry level wages and benefits.

- Finding students and willing teachers in some regions.
- Funding for adult CTE inequitable and inadequate. Grants come, grants go.
- VACTEA's Big Goal- More consistent commitment to Adult CTE statewide.
