## Testimony of Ron Heart, Government Affairs Manager; PrizePicks On behalf Coalition for Fantasy Sports

VT H.127 An Act Relating to Sports Wagering

Chairwoman Cummings and Members of the Committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to address you here today. To the bill sponsors and all other stakeholders, thank you for all of the hard work and due diligence on H.127.

My name is Ron Heart, Senior Manager of Government Affairs for PrizePicks, one of the largest and fastest growing Fantasy Sports companies in North America. However, today I speak on behalf of the Coalition of Fantasy Sports Operators, which includes 3 of the largest fantasy sports companies in North America, being PrizePicks, Underdog Fantasy, and Sleeper, all of whom have been registered in Vermont for 2-3 years now.

Our coalition works to encourage and expand innovation in the rapidly-growing skill-based games industry, and more importantly to protect fantasy sports fans and players all across the country. We are very pleased to see Vermont continue to prioritize consumer protections and responsible play across all verticals, as these are two pillars that our companies prioritize day in and day out when serving our customers in over 30 states.

While we represent some of the leading skill-based operators in our industry, there are dozens of other innovative companies, large and small, just like us, who would love to offer their fantasy sports contests in Vermont.

Knowing that if H.127 passes, the Department of Liquor & Lottery will be conducting an in-depth study on Fantasy Sports in Vermont ahead of January 15th, 2024, and given that we represent a handful of registered fantasy sports operators in VT, we would

welcome the opportunity to serve as a resource to the Department of Liquor and Lottery regarding (1) the education of our skill-based contests and (2) the rapidly growing ecosystem of fantasy sports operators as it stands today.

Our coalition would also welcome the opportunity to provide input and clarity around the current definition of Fantasy Sports Contests so that Vermont's market is inclusive of all skill-based contest types. As such, we have submitted language recommendations for initial consideration, but also look forward to engaging the Department of Liquor and Lottery during their formal review process. At the end of the day, our goal is to ensure security and clarity to all operators within our space.

Again - thank you so much for your time today - and we look forward to working with the state, and other relevant stakeholders, to ensure a responsible and competitive fantasy sports ecosystem in Vermont. Thank you.
