6	clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

8	Subchapter 15. Epinephrine
9	§ 4100m. EPINEPHRINE AUTO-INJECTORS; COVERAGE REQUIRED
10	(a) As used in this section, "health insurance plan" means any individual or
11	group health insurance policy, any hospital or medical service corporation or
12	health maintenance organization subscriber contract, or any other health
13	benefit plan offered, issued, or renewed for any person in this State by a health
14	insurer, as defined by 18 V.S.A. § 9402. The term shall not include benefit
15	plans providing coverage for a specific disease or other limited benefit
16	coverage. "Health insurer" means any insurance company that provides health
17	insurance as defined in subdivision 3301(a)(2) of this title, nonprofit hospital
18	and medical service corporations, and health maintenance organizations.
19	(b) A Except to the extent such coverage would disqualify a high-
20	deductible health plan from eligibility for a health savings account pursuant to
21	26 U.S.C. § 223, a health insurance plan shall provide coverage without any

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1	deductible, coinsurance, co-payment, or other cost-sharing requirement for		
2	epinephrine auto-injectors when prescribed by an insured's health care		
3	provider.		
4	Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE		
5	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2023	January 1, 2025 and shall apply to	
6	all health insurance plans issued on and after January 1, 2025 on such date as a		
7	health insurer offers, issues, or renews the health insurance plan, but in no		
8	event later than January 1, 2026.
