3	Bill No. 125 entitled "An act relating to boards and commissions" respectfully
4	reports that it has considered the same and recommends that the Senate
5	propose to the House that the bill be amended as follows:
6	First: In Sec. 2a, government accountability; Summer Governmdent
7	Accountability Committee; report, by striking out subsection (c) in its entirety
8	and inserting in lieu thereof a new subsection (c) to read as follows:
9	(c) Powers and duties. The Summer Government Accountability
10	Committee shall consider the issue of accountability in the Legislative Branch,
11	including the following:
12	(1) ways to ensure that the Legislative Branch is accountable to the
13	people of Vermont by creating new processes and metrics by which to measure
14	accountability;
15	(2) ways to ensure equity in pay across commissions, boards, and joint
16	legislative committees based on the nature of the service and required skill
17	<u>level;</u>
18	(3) ways to ensure equitable participation on boards and commissions
19	and in any public engagement process mandated by the State or General
20	Assembly by providing appropriate compensation and material support; and

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1	(4) codifying mechanisms for controlling and restraining the increasing
2	number of commissions, boards, and joint legislative committees.
3	Second: By adding a reader assistance heading and a new section to be Sec.
4	4a to read as follows:

9	(e) Nine members A majority of the currently appointed members of the
10	Commission shall constitute a quorum of the Commission. Once a quorum has
11	been established, the vote of a majority of the members present at the time of
12	the vote shall be an act of the Commission.

6	management committee may vote annually, at the committee's final meeting of

8	subsequent year; provided, however, that the quorum shall be not fewer than

11	Sec. 123b. INTERIM QUORUM
12	Notwithstanding 20 V.S.A. § 6(d)(3)(C), until December 31, 2023:
13	(1) not fewer than five voting members of a regional emergency
14	management committee shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of a meeting;
15	and
16	(2) a regional emergency management committee may vote at any time
17	to modify its quorum requirement for meetings in 2024; provided, however,
18	that the quorum shall be not fewer than 20 percent of voting members.
19	Fourth: By adding a reader assistance heading and one new section to be
20	Sec. 139a to read as follows:
21	* * * State Ethics Commission Report on Municipal Ethics * * *

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1	Sec. 139a. REPORT ON MUNICIPAL ETHICS
2	On or before January 15, 2024, the State Ethics Commission shall report to
3	the House Committee on Government Operations and Military Affairs and the
4	Senate Committee on Government Operations with its recommendations for
5	creating a framework for municipal ethics in Vermont. The report shall
6	include a summary of the issues related to creating a framework for municipal
7	ethics in Vermont and a summary of any relevant input received by the
8	Commission in drafting the report. The report shall include specific
9	recommendations on how to best provide cities and towns with informational
10	resources about basic ethics practices. In drafting the report, the Commission
11	may consult with any person it deems necessary to conduct a full and complete
12	analysis of the issue of municipal ethics, including the Vermont League of
13	Cities and Towns and the Office of the Secretary of State.
