5 Sec. 1. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE

- 6 (a) Since its establishment in 1970, Vermont's Agency of Human Services has
- 7 grown significantly in both size and scope. In its current form, the Agency is
- 8 composed of six departments: the Department for Children and Families; the
- 9 Department of Corrections; the Department of Disabilities, Aging, and Independent
- 10 Living; the Department of Health; the Department of Mental Health; and the
- 11 Department of Vermont Health Access, along with several divisions and many offices,
- 12 **boards, and councils.** The Agency's budget comprises more than half of the overall
- 13 State budget, and the programs and benefits administered by the Agency and its
- 14 departments have an impact on the lives of all Vermonters.
- 15 (b) The purpose of this act is to create a meaningful process through which the
- 16 Agency, its departments, and the individuals and organizations with whom they
- 17 engage most can collaborate to identify opportunities to build on past successes and to
- 18 make improvements for the future.

- 21 (a) The Secretary of Human Services, in collaboration with the Deputy Secretary of
- 22 Human Services and the commissioner of each department within the Agency of Human

- 13 (c) The Agency shall solicit open, candid feedback from the stakeholders identified

- 15 development of recommendations. To the extent feasible, the Agency shall engage
- 16 existing boards, committees, and other channels to collect input from individuals and
- 17 families who are directly impacted by the work of the Agency and its departments.
