Vermont's uninsured rate is very low. The Vermont Household Health Insurance Survey reported as of 2021, 97% of Vermonters have health insurance.

- Help Vermonters access health insurance through Medicaid and through the Health Insurance Marketplace, also known as Vermont Health Connect.
- Help Vermonters who are covered by Medicaid access health care services.
- Pay health care providers for delivering care to Medicaid members.
- Spend taxpayer dollars wisely by running an effective, efficient department.



Major Goals

Advancing Value-Based Payment Programs

DVHA pays for health care for Vermonters on Medicaid. Value-based payment programs pay for health care in a new way: instead of paying for each test, service, and procedure, value-based payment programs pay for a whole population of patients and keep track of the quality of that care.

Modernizing Information Technology Infrastructure

Our goal is to implement and utilize systems that are flexible and responsive in the face of changing customer expectations, a shifting federal landscape, and advancements in the health care sector. Vermonters and providers need modern, effective technology systems to sign up for health insurance, to be paid for health care services, and to get the health information they need.

Operational Performance Improvement

Continuous improvement is a core tenet of the Department's work. To improve, we first look at meaningful ways to measure our work, then we gather data and develop scorecards to measure how effective we are. We use these scorecards to drive clinical initiatives, decision making and the pursuit of better customer service, a higher quality of care, and operational efficiencies.
