# 1 TO THE HONORABLE SENATE:

2	The Committee on Government Operations to which was referred House
3	Bill No. 305 entitled "An act relating to professions and occupations regulated
4	by the Office of Professional Regulation" respectfully reports that it has
5	considered the same and recommends that the Senate propose to the House that
6	the bill be amended as follows:
7	First: In Sec. 7, 26 V.S.A. § 2022, by striking out subdivision (14) in its
8	entirety and inserting in lieu thereof a new subdivision (14) to read as follows:
9	(14) "Pharmacy technician" means an individual who, only while

13	immunizations, and performing tests for COVID-19. Pharmacy technicians
14	shall administer immunizations and perform tests for COVID-19 in compliance
15	and accordance with section 2042a of this title.

8	(2) licensed pharmacists are permitted to administer under the State
9	clinical pharmacy protocol, as established in subdivision 2023(b)(2) of this
