The Early Learning Initiative

Launched in 2017, ELI is Mayor Weinberger and the City of Burlington's response to a lack of support and funding for our youngest residents – infants and toddlers.

First Steps Scholarship Capacity Grants







Limitations of the Child Care Financial Assistance Program

- Application process and time requirements
- Reimbursement rates do not take into account the true tuition costs
- Service needs are limited and do not consider extenuating circumstances, especially seen in marginalized communities







First Steps Scholarship Program supports families to both find and pay for care for infants and toddlers.

- Designed to layer **additional support** and funding on top of the Child Care Financial Assistance Program
- We partner with high-quality providers to reserve enrollment spaces
- No family pays more than 5% of their income in weekly copays







First Steps Scholarship Who We Serve

Our families meet qualification requirements:

- Burlington residents
- Families with income at or below 80% AMI
- Families enrolled in the State Child Care Financial Assistance Program (CCFAP) or willing to apply
- Families looking to be enrolled in **full time care** (min. 26 hours/week) at a high-quality child care program







First Steps Scholarship Program Results since 2019

50% growth from Year 1 to Year 3.

90% of applicants have been offered spaces.

89% of those offered spaces have been **enrolled**.

86% of scholarship recipients have stayed enrolled.

73% of families need childcare to stay or find employment.

\$716,000 in scholarships will be awarded in addition to \$1.36M in CCFAP.



Why This Works

Personalized support to navigate child care system

Language Access Grants

Expanding support for diverse populations without adding more costs to the child care programs.

\$800 reimbursement grants offered to **all Burlington providers** and First Steps Scholarship partner programs to cover translation/interpretation costs.







Capacity Grants

The Capacity Grant Program is built to **create more space** in quality child care programs, and **ensure existing spots remain** in the community.

- **\$785,300** awarded since 2018
- 46% increase in capacity in Burlington
 - 3 new child care centers
 - up to 120 new high-quality spots, of which 92 are infant/toddler
 - stabilize 166 spots at high-quality centers
- Expanding to support educators
 - Early Multi-Tiered System of Support social-emotional training course
 - Early Childhood Educator training program pilot with Let's Grow Kids


