Our "Why"

Youth mentoring is an effective, evidence-based tool to meet youth needs.

Young people need supportive adult relationships to thrive.

Youth mentoring programs operated through both schools and nonprofits help to close the mentoring gap and ensure all young people have a trusted mentor to turn to for support.



THE MENTORING GAP:

1 in 3

Young people will grow up without a mentor.



The Impact of Mentoring



less likely than their peers to skip a day of school



55% more likely to be enrolled in college



less likely than their peers to start using drugs



more likely to report participating regularly in sports or extracurricular activities



more likely to volunteer regularly in their communities



more than twice as likely to say that they held a leadership position in a club or spots team

respondents who had a mentor said they are now interested in becoming mentors

More than ever, youth need supportive, committed adults in their life who see, hear, and champion them.

Since March 2020, despite agencies working diligently to meet community needs, the number of mentee-mentor matches has dropped by 35%.

Most mentoring programs are staffed by just one person, often in a part time role.

2007 \$250,000 2011 \$170,000 Despite critical youth mental health needs, and the social and emotional benefits of mentoring, State investment in mentoring has not increased since 2007, and decreased in 2011.

Stagnant funding forces program staff dedicate valuable time to fund development.

We must to find sustainable funding solutions in order for programs to be able to meet the need of their communities, and to expand program access to communities with the greatest need.
