HEAC Overview RE-INTRODUCTION

A 30-member Commission consisting of various state and advocacy representatives created to promote health equity and eradicate health disparities among Vermonters; amplify voices of impacted communities regarding decisions made by the State that impact health equity; and provide strategic guidance on the development of the Office of Health Equity.

- Office of Health Equity (OHE) development guidance
- OHE advice and recomendations
- State agency policy review and monitoring
- Analysis of laws, rules and programs

- Advise VDH and General Assembly on funding
- Distribute grants for community and neighborhood projects
- Advise General Assembly on cultural training for healthcare workers

HEAC Annual Report

- 37 actionable recommendations.
- Requests baseline appropriation of \$1.57 million.
- Addresses Legislature's questions:

Whole of Government Approach

- Health equity must be pursued with an understanding of the persistent nature of the disparate outcomes across all Social Determinants of Health – housing, education, employment, economic development, criminal justice, etc.
- Disparities in the social determinants of health compound adverse outcomes, including poor health, to a life altering, life threatening degree.
- Therefore
 - Advancing equity is the responsibility of the whole of our government
 - All Agencies and Departments within State Government must address inequities in their existing and new policies and programs.

Programmatic Approach

To build health equity, the State must make unified effort on policy, training, data collection, and more. This will require:

- A standardized approach across all government policies and programs using an equity framework.
- Coordination by a centralized authority, the Office of Health Equity.
- Decision-making that is Informed by impacted communities.
- Dedicated administrative and legal support, as well as access to expertise in data analysis, stakeholder engagement, interagency collaboration, policy analysis, and the root causes of historical inequities.

Office of Health Equity

Structure & Responsibilities

- The Office should be charged with working across State government to promote health
 equity and eradicate disparities in health outcomes and access to healthcare and in the social
 determinants that contribute to poor health among Vermonters, including particularly those
 who are Black, Indigenous, and Persons of Color; individuals who are LGBTQ; and individuals
 with disabilities.
- The Office should be authorized to seek the assistance and avail itself of the services of employees of any State agency, department, board, bureau, or commission as it may require and as may be available to it for its purposes.
- All State agencies, departments, boards, bureaus, or commissions should be authorized and directed to cooperate with the Office of Health Equity, to the extent consistent with law.
- The Office should be an independent instrumentality of the State of Vermont in order to facilitate the charge of working across the whole of State government.
- The Office should be advised by the Health Equity Advisory Commission.

Office of Health Equity

Powers, Duties, & Functions

- Leading and coordinating health equity efforts.
- Publishing data reports documenting health disparities.
- Providing education to the public on health equity, health disparities, and social determinants
 of health.
- Conducting State-level strategic planning to eliminate health inequities.
- Coordinating and staffing the Health Equity Advisory Commission.
- Building collaborative partnerships with communities to identify and promote health equity strategies.
- Providing grants to community-based organizations to support individuals who are Black,
 Indigenous, and Persons of Color; individuals who are LGBTQ; and individuals with disabilities and to support ongoing community-based projects that are designed to reduce or eliminate health disparities in Vermont.

Timeline

Apr 12, 2023

HEAC presents report contents to General Assembly

Jan 1, 2024

Director of Health Equity shall be appointed by the HEAC Jul 1, 2024

Director of Health Equity to hire staff to the extent funds are made available by the General Assembly
