



- Line 117 Municipal Pollution Control Grants......\$10,000,000

CWSRF (See also description on Page 57 of the Budget Proposal)

- Planning & Construction loans for Municipal Wastewater, Stormwater, Combined Sewer Overflows – includes plant refurbishment and treatment upgrades, collection system rehab
- Planning & Construction Loans for Private Clean Water Projects
- ▶ Can use up to 2% for Technical assistance and 4% for Loan Administration
- Program was authorized in 1987 and has continuously received annual federal grants since.
- Enabling state law is at 24 VSA Chapter 120
- Vermont Bond Bank and Vermont Economic Development Authority Underwrite CWSRF Loans

CWSRF Loan Terms

- 30 Year max term and cannot exceed useful life of funded project
- Current municipal loan rate is 0% interest plus up to 2% admin fee
- ▶ Current private loan rate is 0% interest plus up to 2.75% admin fee
- Awaiting EPA Base Grant Allotment, but if similar to prior year, expect subsidy of 10% minimum and 40% maximum for municipal recipients
- Two broad categories of subsidy 10% unrestricted and 30% must go to systems that lack affordability ~ \$0.37M to \$1.48M
- Affordability based on community median household income, user rate, unemployment, population trend, and unforeseen hardship

- 108 applications received and still under review
- Some projects on SFY23 PPL that qualify for grants and did not proceed reapplied for the SFY24 PPL
