





#### IMPROVED WATER SUPPLY- SOUTH VERNON

Thanks to the work of the Rural Fire Protection Program; the Vernon Volunteer Fire Department will be receiving funding toward the installation of a dry hydrant in the South End of Vernon at 4667 Fort Bridgman Rd. (The Newton Brook, behind the brick building).

The hydrant was installed this summer, graciously by the work of our town Highway Department, and is now in functional operation.

With the addition of this hydrant, our department will have a more reliable water source, and an easier time accessing it. The pond used in the past, which is across the road, was continuing to be silted in, and requiring to be dredged. Our new hydrant will allow for a more consistent water source, and less of an environmental impact with future maintenance.

The Chittenden Volunteer Fire Department completed the repair of a dry hydrant on August 20, 2022 at the Smith Farm Road fire pond. The repair of this dry hydrant is part of a comprehensive program to improve fire protection in the rural portions of Chittenden.

The Chittenden Volunteer Fire Department is in the process of improving fire protection in town by installing and maintaining dry hydrants and other Rural Fire Protection (RFP) systems to improve the availability and accessibility of water for firefighting purposes. The Vermont Rural Fire Protection Task Force through the Vermont Association of Conservation Districts (VACD) provided grant funds and technical advice to the Chittenden Volunteer Fire Department by providing an upgraded 6" NH male adaptor for the neighborhood's dry hydrant. Monies were also provided to the Smith Farm Owners Association to clean and repair the existing FRP pond.

The Vermont Legislature approved appropriations to assist communities in installing and upgrading dry hydrants to improve fire protection in the rural areas of Vermont. The Vermont Rural Fire Protection Task Force, with the assistance of the VACD, administers the grant program that provides financial assistance.

Dry hydrants and other RFP systems are a preferred method of providing water for firefighting in areas where there are no water mains. A dry hydrant consists of a 6-8" pipe with a fitting to which a pump/tanker can attach. The pipe connects to a water source (pond or stream) that can supply at least 60,000 gallons under drought conditions.


