The definition of a prison sentence is sentenced to serve (maximum) more than one year (US Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Statistics). Thus, recidivism does NOT include the incarcerated individuals released each year with a shorter "jail" sentence of one year or less. Note: Due to the definition of recidivism provided in the above citation, the most up-to-date recidivism calculation is for 3 years prior to the current calendar year.	Annual
