

1 TO THE HONORABLE SENATE:

2 The Committee on Natural Resources and Energy to which was referred
3 Senate Bill No. 258 entitled “An act relating to the management of fish and
4 wildlife” respectfully reports that it has considered the same and recommends
5 that the bill be amended by striking out all after the enacting clause and
6 inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7 * * * Fish and Wildlife Board; Governance * * *

8 Sec. 1. 10 V.S.A. §§ 4041 and 4042 are amended to read:

9 § 4041. DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND WILDLIFE; FISH AND WILDLIFE
10 BOARD; MEMBERS, TERM, CHAIR

11 (a) There is hereby established a Department of Fish and Wildlife ~~that shall~~
12 ~~be administered by the Commissioner.~~ The Department shall be under the
13 direction and supervision of a Commissioner appointed by the Secretary as
14 provided in 3 V.S.A. § 2851. In addition to the duties and powers provided
15 under this chapter, the Commissioner shall have the powers and duties
16 specified in 3 V.S.A. § 2852 and such additional duties as may be assigned to
17 the Commissioner by the Secretary under 3 V.S.A. § 2853. The Commissioner
18 shall implement the policy and purposes specified in section 4081 of this title
19 where appropriate and to the extent that resources of the Department permit.

20 (b)(1) There is hereby established a Fish and Wildlife Board. The purpose
21 of the Board shall be to serve in an advisory capacity to the Department of Fish

1 and Wildlife in the establishment of Department rules and any policies therein
2 regarding the management and conservation of wildlife in the State, except for
3 establishment of rules and policies related to wildlife regulated under chapter
4 123 of this title.

5 (2) The Board shall consist of 44 15 members, one from each county,
6 appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate and one
7 at large member. **Five members of the Board shall be appointed by the**
8 **Commissioner, five members of the Board shall be appointed by the**
9 **Speaker of the House, and five members of the Board shall be appointed**
10 **by the Committee on Committees.** The members of the Board shall be
11 appointed for a term of six years, or the unexpired portion thereof, and during
12 their terms the 14 members appointed by county shall reside in the county from
13 which they are appointed. In the event a member resigns or no longer resides
14 in the county from which ~~he or she~~ the member was appointed, the ~~Governor~~
15 authority that appointed the member shall appoint a new member from that
16 county for the unexpired portion of the term. Appointments shall be made in
17 ~~such a~~ a manner that either two or three terms shall expire each year. A member
18 ~~-serving a full six-year term shall not be eligible for reappointment~~ shall be
19 eligible to serve a maximum of two full six-year terms. The ~~Governor~~
20 Commissioner shall biennially designate a chair.

1 (3) In order to be appointed to the Board, a person shall apply in writing
2 to the appointing authority. The appointing authority shall acknowledge, in
3 writing, the receipt of each application.

4 (4) In considering applicants to the Board, the appointing authority shall
5 give due consideration to:

6 (A) the need for the Board members to have a history of involvement
7 with and dedication to fish and wildlife, including a knowledge of fish and
8 wildlife biology, ecology, and the ethics of fish and wildlife management;

9 (B) the need for the Board to have a balanced representation and
10 include members of the public representing an approximately equal number of
11 licensed users and nonlicensed users of wildlife; and

12 (C) coordinating their appointments to ensure the appropriate
13 composition of the board as required by this subsection (b).

14 (5) As used in this subsection:

15 (A) “licensed user of wildlife” means a person who has held a
16 Vermont hunting, fishing, or trapping license in each of the previous five years
17 prior to appointment; and

18 (B) “nonlicensed user of wildlife” means a person who has not held a
19 Vermont hunting, fishing, or trapping license in any of the previous five years
20 prior to appointment.

1 (c) Upon appointment, each Board member shall receive training from the
2 Department on wildlife management and hunting ethics, such as the North
3 American Model of Wildlife Conservation; wildlife biology; coexistence with
4 wildlife; the reduction of conflict between humans and wildlife; and the
5 impacts of climate change on fish and wildlife.

6 (d) Upon the filing of a proposed rule with the Secretary of State pursuant
7 to 3 V.S.A. § 838, the Department shall submit the proposed rule to the Board
8 for its review. After a public hearing and an opportunity for the public to
9 submit written comments, the Board shall consider whether a proposed rule is
10 designed to maintain the best health, population, viewing opportunities, and
11 utilization levels of the regulated species and of other necessary or desirable
12 species that are ecologically related to the regulated species and whether the
13 rules are adequately supported by investigation and research conducted by the
14 Department. If the Board, by majority vote, determines that a proposed rule
15 should be revised, it shall submit a written report to the Department setting
16 forth its recommended revisions, and the reasons therefore, within 60 days
17 following its receipt of a proposed rule. The Board shall include with its report
18 the public comments it received. The Department shall consider fully any
19 recommendations by the Board. If the Board’s recommendations are not
20 included in the rule, the Department shall issue a written explanation of why it
21 did not include the Board’s recommendations in the rule. The Board’s written

1 report and the Department’s response thereto shall be included with the
2 materials submitted to the Legislative Committee on Administrative Rules
3 under 3 V.S.A. § 841.

5 ~~The Commissioner shall be appointed pursuant to the provisions of 3~~
6 ~~V.S.A. § 2851. The Commissioner shall also be Executive Secretary of the~~

9 § 4081. POLICY

10 (a)(1) As provided by Chapter II, § 67 of the Constitution of the State of
11 Vermont, the fish and wildlife of Vermont are held in trust by the State for the
12 benefit of the citizens of Vermont and shall not be reduced to private
13 ownership. The State of Vermont, in its sovereign capacity as a trustee for the
14 citizens of the State, shall have ownership, jurisdiction, and control of all of the
15 fish and wildlife of Vermont.

16 (2) The Commissioner of Fish and Wildlife shall manage and regulate
17 the fish and wildlife of Vermont in accordance with the requirements of this
18 part ~~and the rules of the Fish and Wildlife Board, including the Department of~~
19 Fish and Wildlife rules on Non-game Management as set forth in Code of
20 Vermont Rules 12-010-028. ~~The protection, propagation control,~~
21 ~~management, and conservation of fish, wildlife, and fur-bearing animals in this~~

1 ~~State are in the interest of the public welfare.~~ It is in the public welfare to
2 protect, manage, and conserve the fish and wildlife of the State and the habitats
3 in which they reside. The State, through the Commissioner of Fish and
4 Wildlife, shall safeguard the fish, ~~and~~ wildlife, and fur-bearing animals of the
5 State for the people of the State, and the State shall fulfill this duty with a
6 constant and continual vigilance.

7 (b) ~~Notwithstanding the provisions of 3 V.S.A. § 2803, the Fish and~~
8 ~~Wildlife Board shall be the State agency charged with carrying out the~~
9 ~~purposes of this subchapter.~~

10 (e) ~~An abundant,~~ A healthy deer herd is a primary goal one of the most
11 important goals of fish and wildlife management. The use of a limited unit
12 open season on antlerless deer shall be implemented only after a scientific
13 game management study by the Department of Fish and Wildlife supports such
14 a season.

15 (d)(c) Annually, the Department shall update a scientific management
16 study of the State deer herd. The study shall consider data provided by
17 Department biologists and citizen testimony taken under subsection (f)(e) of
18 this section.

19 (e)(d) Based on the results of the updated management study and citizen
20 testimony, the ~~Board~~ Department shall decide whether an antlerless deer
21 hunting season is necessary and, if so, how many permits are to be issued. If

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1 the ~~Board~~ Department determines that an antlerless season is necessary, it shall
2 adopt a rule creating one and the Department shall then administer an
3 antlerless program.

4 ~~(e)~~(e) Annually, the Department shall hold regional public hearings to
5 receive testimony and data from concerned citizens about their knowledge and
6 concerns about the deer herd. The ~~Board~~ Department shall identify the regions
7 by rule.

8 ~~(e)~~(f) If the ~~Board~~ Department finds that an antlerless season is necessary
9 to maintain the health and size of the herd, the Department shall administer an
10 antlerless deer program. Annually, the ~~Board~~ Department shall determine how
11 many antlerless permits to issue in each wildlife management unit. For a
12 nonrefundable fee of \$10.00 for residents and \$25.00 for nonresidents, a
13 person may apply for a permit. Each person may submit only one application
14 for a permit. The Department shall allocate the permits in the following
15 manner:

16 (1) A Vermont landowner, as defined in section 4253 of this title, who
17 owns 25 or more contiguous acres and who applies shall receive a permit for
18 antlerless hunting in the management unit on which the land is located before
19 any are given to people eligible under subdivision (2) of this subsection. If the
20 land is owned by more than one individual, corporation, or other entity, only
21 one permit shall be issued. Landowners applying for antlerless permits under

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1 this subdivision shall not, at the time of application or thereafter during the
2 regular hunting season, post their lands except under the provisions of section
3 4710 of this title. As used in this section, “post” means any signage that would
4 lead a reasonable person to believe that hunting is restricted on the land. If the
5 number of landowners who apply exceeds the number of permits for that
6 district, the Department shall award all permits in that district to landowners by
7 lottery.

8 (2) Permits remaining after allocation pursuant to subdivision (1) of this
9 subsection shall be issued by lottery.

10 (3) Any permits remaining after permits have been allocated pursuant to
11 subdivisions (1) and (2) of this subsection shall be issued by the Department
12 for a \$10.00 fee for residents. Ten percent of the remaining permits may be
13 issued to nonresident applicants for a \$25.00 fee.

15 § 4082. VERMONT FISH AND WILDLIFE REGULATIONS

16 (a) The ~~Board~~ Department may adopt rules, under 3 V.S.A. chapter 25, to
17 be known as the “Vermont Fish and Wildlife Regulations” for the management
18 of all wildlife and the regulation of fish and wild game and the taking thereof
19 except as otherwise specifically provided by law. The rules shall be designed
20 to maintain the best health, population, and utilization levels of the regulated
21 species and of other necessary or desirable species that are ecologically related

1 ~~to the regulated species~~ all wildlife. The rules shall be supported by
2 ~~investigation and research conducted by the Department on behalf of the Board~~
3 the best science available through Department and peer reviewed research.

4 (b)(1) Except as provided for under subdivision (2) of this subsection, the
5 ~~Board~~ Department annually may adopt rules relating to the management of
6 migratory game birds; and shall follow the procedures for rulemaking
7 contained in 3 V.S.A. chapter 25. For each ~~such~~ rule, the ~~Board~~ Department
8 shall conduct a hearing but, when necessary, may schedule the hearing for a
9 day before the terms of the rule are expected to be determined.

10 (2) Beginning with the 2015 hunting season, the ~~Board~~ Department may
11 set by procedure the daily bag and possession limits of migratory game birds
12 that may be harvested in each Waterfowl Hunting Zone annually without
13 following the procedures for rulemaking contained in 3 V.S.A. chapter 25.
14 The annual daily bag and possession limits of migratory game birds shall be
15 consistent with federal requirements. Prior to setting the migratory game bird
16 daily bag and possession limits, the ~~Board~~ Department shall provide a period
17 of not less than 30 days of public notice and shall conduct at least two public
18 informational hearings. The final migratory game bird daily bag and
19 possession limits shall be enforceable by the Department under its enforcement
20 authority in part 4 of this title.

1 (c) The ~~Board~~ Department may set by procedure the annual number of
2 antlerless deer that can be harvested in each Wildlife Management Unit and the
3 annual number of moose that can be harvested in each Wildlife Management
4 Unit without following the procedures for rulemaking contained in 3 V.S.A.
5 chapter 25. The annual numbers of antlerless deer and moose that can be
6 harvested shall be supported by investigation and research conducted by the
7 Department ~~on behalf of the Board~~. Prior to setting the antlerless deer and
8 moose permit numbers, the ~~Board~~ Department shall provide a period of not
9 less than 30 days of public notice and shall conduct at least three public
10 informational hearings. The public informational hearings may be conducted
11 simultaneously with the regional antlerless deer meetings required by
12 10 V.S.A. App. § 2b. The final annual antlerless deer and moose harvest
13 permit numbers shall be enforceable by the Department under its enforcement
14 authority in part 4 of this title. The final annual antlerless deer and moose
15 harvest permit numbers shall be reported to the House Committee on
16 Environment and Energy and the Senate Committee on Natural Resources and
17 Energy as part of the annual deer report required under section 4084 of this
18 title. The provisions of 2 V.S.A. § 20(d) (expiration of required reports) shall
19 not apply to the report to be made under this subsection.

2 (d) The Commissioner of Fish and Wildlife, according to the provisions of
3 3 V.S.A. chapter 25 and after consultation with the Fish and Wildlife Board
4 and the Endangered Species Committee, shall adopt a rule establishing a plan
5 for nongame wildlife. The rule may be amended from time to time, and shall
6 be reviewed, after public hearings, at least every five years. The plan shall
7 contain:

8 (1) strategies to manage, inventory, preserve, protect, perpetuate, and
9 enhance all nongame wildlife in the State, including identification of wildlife
10 species in need of protection and information on their population distributions,
11 habitat requirements, limiting factors, and other pertinent biological and

17 A person shall not take fish, except in accordance with this part and

2 § 2803. ADVISORY CAPACITY

3 (a) All boards, committees, councils, activities, and departments ~~which~~ that
4 under this chapter are a part of the Agency shall be advisory only, except as
5 hereinafter provided, and the powers and duties of such boards, committees,
6 councils, activities, and departments, including administrative, policy making,
7 rulemaking, and regulatory functions, shall vest in and be exercised by the
8 Secretary of the Agency.

9 (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section or any other provision of
10 this chapter, ~~the Fish and Wildlife Board and the Natural Resources Board~~
11 shall retain and exercise all powers and functions given to ~~them~~ it by law

18 When preparing the Vermont Statutes Annotated for publication, the Office
19 of Legislative Counsel shall make the following revisions throughout the

21 revisions have no other effect on the meaning of the affected statutes:

1 (1) replace “Board” with “Department” in 10 V.S.A. §§ 4605, 4701,
2 4702, 4742a, 4828, 4830, 4861, 4902, and 5001; and

6 (a) The Vermont Fish and Wildlife regulations adopted by the Fish and
7 Wildlife Board and in effect as of the effective date of this act shall remain in
8 effect and have the full force and effect of law until such time as they are
9 repealed or amended by the General Assembly by legislative act or by the
10 Department of Fish and Wildlife pursuant to 3 V.S.A. chapter 25.

11 (b) The members of the Fish and Wildlife Board as of the effective date of
12 this act shall continue to serve as members of the Board until all new members
13 of the Board are appointed under 10 V.S.A. § 4041(b) or 90 days after the
14 effective date of this act, whichever occurs first.

7 fox, skunk, coyote, bobcat, weasel, opossum, lynx, wolf, and muskrat.

9 (15) Wild animals or wildlife: all animals, including birds, fish,
10 amphibians, and reptiles, other than domestic animals, domestic fowl, or
11 domestic pets.

12 * * *

13 (23) Take and taking: pursuing, shooting, hunting, killing, capturing,
14 trapping, snaring, and netting fish, birds, and quadrupeds and all lesser acts,
15 such as disturbing, harrying, worrying, or wounding or placing, setting,
16 drawing, or using any net or other device commonly used to take fish or wild
17 animals, whether they result in the taking or not; and shall include every
18 attempt to take and every act of assistance to every other person in taking or
19 attempting to take fish or wild animals, provided that when taking is allowed
20 by law, reference is had to taking by lawful means and in a lawful manner.

1 (42) “Trapping” means to take or attempt to take fur-bearing animals
2 with traps including the dispatching of lawfully trapped fur-bearing animals.

4 § 4866. SETBACKS; TRAPPING

5 (a) As used in this section:

6 (1) “Public highway,” means any highway, as that term is defined in
7 24 V.S.A. § 4, including Class 4 roads, shown on the highway maps of the
8 respective towns made by the Agency of Transportation, but shall not include
9 trails.

10 (2) “Trail” means a path or corridor open to the public, including all
11 areas used for nonmotorized recreational purposes such as hiking, walking,
12 bicycling, cross-country skiing, horseback riding, and other similar activities.

13 (b) No foothold trap or body-gripping trap shall be set:

14 (1) on or within 50 feet of a trail or a public highway, including when
15 the trap is set in water or under the ice.

16 (2) on or within 100 feet of a building, parking lot, visitor center, park,
17 playground, picnic area, shelter, pavilion, school, camp or campground,
18 recreational facility, or any other area where persons may reasonably be

15 ~~taking purposes, without a permit issued by the Commissioner.~~

16 ~~(1) The Commissioner may deny any permit at the Commissioner’s~~
17 ~~discretion. The Commissioner shall not issue more than 100 permits annually.~~

18 ~~(2) The number of permits that the Commissioner issues to nonresidents~~
19 ~~in any given year shall not exceed 10 percent of the number of permits issued~~
20 ~~to residents in the preceding year. The Commissioner shall establish a process~~
21 ~~and standards for determining which nonresidents are to receive a permit,~~

1 ~~including who will receive a permit if there are more nonresident applicants~~
