

ARPA-funded climate investments through 2026:

- \$45 M to OEO to support low-income weatherization
- \$35 M to EVT for moderate-income weatherization
- \$20 M to support home electric upgrades to enable electrification for low- and moderate-income households
- \$5 M to install heat pump water heaters for low- and moderate-income households
- \$7 M to support storage installations and load management

General Fund investment:

- \$9 M to VHFA for tariff-on-bill financing and incentives through the Weatherization Repayment Assistance Pilot (WRAP)

Congressionally-directed spending:

- \$8.5 M to Vermont Energy Investment Corporation for Clean Heat Homes to weatherize Vermont homes by providing on-bill financing and subsidies to households with incomes between 80 and 120 percent of Area Median Income that would not otherwise be eligible for subsidies.

Inflation Reduction Act direct funding to State Energy Offices

- \$29 Million through the Public Service Dept. for the *home energy performance-based, whole house rebates (HOME Program)* to fund comprehensive energy savings projects
- \$29 Million through the Public Service Dept. for the *High-Efficiency Electric Home Rebate Program* to provide point of sale rebates for electrification technologies for households earning up to 150% Area Median Income
