S.264 - Background

- VT's DMV has an excellent program recognizing veterans
- 7.3% of American's have served in the military. Total living Vets in VT 35,000.
- 10% of veteran's have served in combat zones
- Vetted Department of Defense awards
- Co-Sponsors: Senators Campion, Ingalls, Wrenner, Gulick, Hashim, Norris, and Williams



Goal 1 – Adding Two Military Decorations

- Amend Sec 2. 23 VSA 304 (j)
- Additions: Silver Star and Distinguished Flying Cross
- Silver Star.
 - Third-highest military decoration for valor in combat.
 - Established in 1926
- <u>Distinguished Flying Cross</u>.
 - Awarded to distinguish themselves by acts of heroism or extraordinary achievement while participating in aerial flight.
 - Established in 1918
- Estimated 200 living Vermont awardees
