
This act summary is provided for the convenience of the public and members of the General Assembly. It is intended to provide a general summary of the act and may not be exhaustive. It has been prepared by the staff of the Office of Legislative Counsel without input from members of the General Assembly. It is not intended to aid in the interpretation of legislation or to serve as a source of legislative intent.

Act No. 111 (H.559). An act relating to the Parole Board

Subjects: Corrections; Parole Board

This act requires regular training for Parole Board members. It directs that the Parole Board shall consist of seven regular members, instead of five regular members and two alternates. The act further requires the Governor to consult with the Parole Board Director and the Chair of the Parole Board and to consider a balance of knowledge and experience in appointing Parole Board members. The act establishes the Parole Board Legal Counsel Pilot Project, carries forward and appropriates money for the pilot project, and requires the Parole Board Director to submit a report on the operation of the pilot project. The act further requires the Parole Board Director to submit a proposed budget to the Commissioner of Corrections and the Secretary of Human Services and to submit a report detailing the budget development process. The act further clarifies that victims can waive notifications from the Department of Corrections.
