14	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require the
15	Governor to get approval of the General Assembly before entering into certain
16	immigration agreements.

An act relating to requiring legislative approval prior to entering into certainimmigration agreements

1	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
2	Sec. 1. 20 V.S.A. § 4652 is amended to read:
3	§ 4652. AUTHORIZATION TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENTS
4	PURSUANT TO 8 U.S.C. § 1357(g) AND 19 U.S.C. § 1401(i)
5	(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, only the Governor, in
6	consultation with the Vermont Attorney General upon approval from the
7	General Assembly as set forth in subsection (b) of this section, is authorized to
8	enter into, modify, or extend an agreement pursuant to 8 U.S.C. § 1357(g) or
9	19 U.S.C. § 1401(i).
10	(b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, a State, county, or
11	municipal law enforcement agency is authorized to enter into an agreement
12	pursuant to 8 U.S.C. § 1357(g) or 19 U.S.C. § 1401(i) when necessary to
13	address threats to the public safety or welfare of Vermont residents arising out
14	of a declaration of a State or national emergency.
15	(1) The Governor shall not enter into an agreement pursuant to 8 U.S.C.
16	<u>§ 1357(g) or 19 U.S.C. § 1401(i) without prior approval from the General</u>
17	Assembly.
18	(2) Not fewer than 60 days before the General Assembly may vote on a
19	proposed agreement pursuant to subdivision (1) of this subsection, the
20	Governor shall:

1	(i) the full text of the proposed agreement; and
2	(ii) an analysis of the potential fiscal, social, and legal impacts of
3	the agreement; and
4	(B) hold one or more public hearings in order to inform and gather

6	proposed agreement.
7	(3) No agreement pursuant to 8 U.S.C. § 1357(g) or 19 U.S.C. § 1401(i)
8	shall be entered into if the General Assembly is not in session.
